

Rates for Registration of Seed Treatments

(Christchurch, May 2007)

ISF recognizes that registered rates for seed treatments are dependent on the target pests and should be based on science. However, multiple registered rates of seed treatment products in different countries are often a barrier to treated seed movement across international borders, reducing the availability of genetics to farmers. Therefore, ISF strongly encourages seed treatment manufacturers to apply for and regulators to register uniform active ingredient application rates for seed treatment products on a per crop basis thus facilitating the free movement of treated seed in the international market place.
